## 1. Events from last year

- Invited Guest Speaker: Nicole Dubilier
  - Send out survey to find a new speaker for this year (only one per year)
  - Since previous speaker was in the Microbiology concentration, Micro speakers will be excluded from this year's selection to make it fair to other concentrations
  - Expenses for inviting a speaker will be covered by the department (hotel, travel, meals honorarium, etc)
  - Encourage fellow grad students to let their PIs know if there's someone they want to come speak and see if the faculty can use their slots to invite them
- Coffee Hours Michael will pay for these as well
  - Department will cover expenses for food/drinks
  - We can get food from outside places if price is comparable
    - 4 weeks advance approval for outside food
    - Potential places: Bagel Zone; Brueggers; Lox, stox and bagels
- Twitter panel
  - Potentially host this event again
- Fundraisers
  - o T-shirt sales
    - Try selling other items such as stickers, hats, notebooks, etc. with the logo in the future
  - o Blaze pizza

#### 2. Planning more events for this year

- Host grad student panel for undergrads
  - Answer questions about grad student life/research outside of a classroom setting
  - Ask for RSVPs to judge attendance size
- Lab tours with undergrads/high school students
- Organize demos with local afterschool programs (Grades 2<sup>nd</sup> 8<sup>th</sup>)
  - Sarah McAnulty has organized this in the past; students really enjoyed it
- Plan more professional development events
  - Kevin Boyd will organize a python programming tutorial
  - Potentially organize an R bootcamp with Pat Schloss (<u>University of Michigan</u>) if there is enough interest

- Develop workshops on mentoring (both being a mentor and a mentee) based on seminar series developed by Jo Handelsman (<u>University of Wisconsin-Madison</u>)
- Plan workshop around AAAS's <u>IDP</u> website to discuss future career planning
- Get more speakers from industry settings
  - Possibly coordinate time with invited speakers from the PSM program
- Improving new grad student recruitment
  - Suggestions have already been made for increasing interactions with current grad students (without faculty present)
- Drink with a scientist outreach event
  - First event has been organized by Katrina Velle
  - Nathan Hale, August 15<sup>th</sup>, featuring Barbara Mellone and John Malone
  - Will try to expand to outside locations
- Science communication workshops
  - First one organized by Sarah McAnulty for August 8<sup>th</sup> with the plant sciences department
- Grad Seminar Travel Awards
  - The best speaker from the grad seminar series will be awarded a travel grant (funded by the department)
  - o Rules and judging still being organized by Michael Lynes
  - In general, we will encourage there be multiple comment forms in the future printed in different colors, so you can know if feedback is coming from an undergrad, grad student, or faculty

- Send out a survey to all MCB grad students

  - Include a new anonymous suggestions page
